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Dual SIM phone settings

With a dual SIM phone, you can use one or two SIM cards. If there's only one SIM in the phone, it's ready to use. With two cards inserted, you can use either or both.

To set up your phone to use two SIM cards, insert both cards, turn on your phone and follow the prompts. To finish dual SIM setup, drag down the status bar at the top of the Home screen and tap **Welcome to your dual SIM phone**.

Tip: with two SIM cards, you see at the top of your Home screen.

Note: to quickly open settings, swipe down the status bar with two fingers and tap **‡**.

Battery life

Your phone is like a small computer that processes tons of information and apps at lightning-fast speed. Depending on what you use, that can take a lot of power.

To see what's using up battery power, tap Apps ::: > Settings > Battery.

To turn on Battery saver, tap Apps (:::) > \$\square\$ Settings > Battery, then tap Menu \$\frac{1}{2}\$ > Battery saver.

Note: to quickly open settings, swipe down the status bar with two fingers and tap **\(\frac{1}{3} \)**.

Tips and tricks

To save even more battery life between charges, you could reduce:

- GPS use: swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap \$\subseteq > \text{Location} > \text{Mode} > \text{Battery saving} to turn off GPS tracking.
- Display brightness: swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap > Display > Brightness level > (slide dimmer setting left). Make sure Adaptive brightness is also turned on.
- Display timeout delay: swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap \$\infty > \text{Display} > \text{Sleep} > (shorter setting).
- Activity of seldom-used apps: swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap \$\frac{\phi}{2}\$ > Battery, then tap

Menu > Battery optimisation > All apps. Tap the app you want to adjust, then tap Optimise.

- Widgets that stream information to your Home screen, such as news or weather.
- Unused online accounts that you registered: swipe the status bar down with two fingers, tap 🌣 > Accounts. Tap the account you want to remove. Tap it again, then tap Menu ? > Remove account.
- Recording or watching videos, listening to music or taking pictures.

Warning: don't try to remove or replace the battery yourself - doing so may damage the battery and could cause burning and injury. If your phone becomes unresponsive, try a reboot – press and hold the Power button until the screen goes dark, and your phone restarts.



The Home screen is what you see when you first turn on your phone. From here, you can explore apps and more.

- Search: type text in the Google Search box at the top of your Home screen, or tap J to search by voice.
- Open app list: to see your apps, tap Apps (:::).



Tips and tricks

- Widgets: to put widgets such as a clock, interactive calendar and more on your Home screen, touch and hold an empty spot on the Home screen, then tap WIDGETS.
- Pages: to add a page, drag an app to the right-hand side of the screen until you see a white bar. You can add multiple pages. To show other pages of shortcuts and widgets, swipe the Home screen left.
- Google Now™: touch and hold Home O. After setup, you can access it by swiping right from the Home screen. For more, see "Google Now™".
- Settings: to guickly open settings, swipe the status bar down with two fingers. To open more settings, tap **a**.
- Shortcuts: tap Apps (:::), touch and hold an app, then drag it to one of your Home screen pages. To see all your apps, tap Apps (:::)
- Apps: to remove an app from a Home screen page, touch and hold the app, then drag it to Remove. The app isn't removed from your phone, just the Home screen.



Set the ringtone, media or alarm volume

To turn off all sounds, except alarms, turn the volume all the way down.

Do not disturb

To access the do not disturb feature, swipe the status bar down with two fingers, and tap Do not disturb.

Tap one of these options:

- Total silence: turn off all sounds and alarms. Override sound settings from other apps. Set how long to stay in this mode, or choose indefinitely.

- Apps use up memory, data, battery and processing power - some more than others. If you're not happy with how much memory, data, battery or processing power it's using, uninstall it.
- Monitor children's access to apps to help prevent exposure to inappropriate content.
- Certain apps may not provide completely accurate information. Take care, especially when it comes to personal health.

You will only be asked for permissions when you use a feature in an app, instead of all at once when you install the арр.

To modify the app permissions by app type (such as Calendar or Camera) at any time, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iv) > > Apps, then tap Settings > App permissions.

Then, try removing the app.

• Reinstall apps: to reinstall apps on Google Play, tap Apps (:::) > Play Store, then tap = > My apps & games. The apps you downloaded are listed and available for download.

• Dialling and commands: tap J. To dial, say "Call" and then a contact name or phone number. Or, say a command such as "Send text", "Go to" an app or "Help" for voice command help.

You can also use the fingerprint sensor on your phone. After you set it up, you'll see it on the unlock screen instead of the regular lock.
- Notifications: double tap a notification to open it. You'll be prompted to enter your passcode.

Tip: to choose what app notifications to hear or display. Hear: tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (settings > Sound & notification > App notifications, then tap an app.

- Owner info: to add a message to your lock screen, tap Apps (:::) > (ii) Settings > Security > Lock screen message.
- Tip: don't put your mobile number as your contact info unless you can access your voice mail from another device.

- Message alert: to change your message notification settings, tap Apps (:::) > | Messenger > Menu > Settings and tick Notifications
- Display settings: to change brightness, colour mode and other display settings, tap Apps (::) > (iii) > (iii) > (iv) Settings > Display.
- Rotate: in many apps, the touchscreen switches from portrait to landscape when you rotate your phone. To turn this on or off, swipe down the status bar with two fingers and tap Auto-rotate.

Tips and tricks

- Quick settings: get to the most used settings quickly. Swipe down the status bar with two fingers. See "Quick settings".
- Bluetooth™ devices: to connect a Bluetooth headset keyboard or other device, tap Bluetooth.
- Wi-Fi networks: to connect, tap Wi-Fi.



- Wi-Fi hotspot: to make your phone a hotspot, check out "Wi-Fi hotspot".
- USB cable: your phone's micro USB port lets you exchange media and other files with a connected computer. To change the type of USB connection, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iiii) > (ivision Settings > Storage & USB > Menu • > USB computer connection.
- Automatic connections: when Bluetooth or Wi-Fi power is on, your phone automatically reconnects to available devices or networks it has used before.
- Aeroplane mode: need to shut down wireless connections quickly? Swipe down the status bar with two fingers and tap Aeroplane mode.
- Print: want to print your photos, docs or other things? Check out "Print".

Bluetooth wireless

Turn Bluetooth power on/off

Note: swipe down the status bar with two fingers to guickly turn Bluetooth on or off.

Tip: to extend battery life or stop connections, turn Bluetooth off when you're not using it.



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Connect & transfer

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Connect devices

The first time you connect a Bluetooth device, follow these steps:

- 1 Make sure the device you are pairing with is in discoverable mode (for details, refer to the guide that came with the device)
- 2 Tap Apps (:::) > a Settings > Bluetooth.
- 3 Make sure the switch is on
- 4 Tap a found device to connect it (if necessary, tap Pair or enter a passkey such as 0000).

Tip: tap to rename the device.

When the device connects, the Bluetooth status indicator shows at the top of the screen \$\mathbb{X}\$.

To automatically **disconnect** or **reconnect** a device anytime. such as a wireless headset, just turn the device off or on.

Note: using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the law and drive safely.

Manage devices

To manually reconnect your phone with a paired device, tap the device name in the list

To manually disconnect your phone from a paired device, tap the device name in the devices list, then tap OK.

To remove a paired device, tap a next to the device name, then tap Unpair.

To change the name your phone shows to other devices, tap then tap Menu • > Rename this phone. Enter a name and tap RENAME.

Let devices find your phone

To let a Bluetooth device discover your phone, just turn the Bluetooth switch on.

Transfer files

- Photos or videos: open the photo or video, then tap < > Bluetooth.
- Contacts: tap Apps (:::) > Z Contacts, tap a person, then tap Menu > Share > Bluetooth.

Wi-Fi networks

Turn Wi-Fi power on/off

Find it: Apps (:::) > Settings > Wi-Fi, then tap the switch to turn it on

Note: swipe down the status bar with two fingers to guickly turn Wi-Fi on or off.

Connect to networks

To find networks in your range:

- 1 Tap Apps (:::) > (iii) Settings > Wi-Fi.
 - Tip: to show your phone's MAC address and Wi-Fi settings, tap Menu > Advanced.
- 2 Make sure the Wi-Fi switch is turned on.



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3 Tap a found network to connect it (if necessary, enter Network SSID, Security and Wireless password, and tap Connect).

When your phone connects, the Wi-Fi status indicator \Rightarrow appears in the status bar.

Note: if you see a guestion mark in the Wi-Fi status indicator , swipe the status bar down, tap the network and enter the network's password.

Tip: when Wi-Fi is on, your phone automatically reconnects to available networks it has used before. If a router previously had no Internet connection, your phone will not automatically connect to it.

Wi-Fi hotspot

Note: this phone supports apps and services that may use a lot of data, so make sure your data plan meets your needs. Contact your service provider for details.

You can make your phone a Wi-Fi hotspot to provide portable, convenient Internet access to other Wi-Fi-enabled devices

Note: keep it secure. To protect your phone and hotspot from unauthorised access, it is strongly recommended that you set up hotspot security (WPA2 is the most secure), including password.

Find it: Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iv) > hotspot and select Mobile Wi-Fi hotspot

Note: these steps may vary depending on your network.

- 1 Your phone turns off Wi-Fi and uses the mobile network for Internet access. Tap Set up Wi-Fi hotspot to set up security:
 - Network SSID: enter a unique name for your hotspot.
 - Security: select the type of security you want: open or WPA2. For WPA2, enter a unique password that others will need to access your Wi-Fi hotspot.

Note: WPA2 is recommended by IEEE.

• Password: create a password with at least eight characters.

2 Tap SAVE.

When your Wi-Fi hotspot is active, other Wi-Fi enabled devices can connect by entering your hotspot's **Network** name, selecting a Security type and entering the correct Wireless password.

For those who like to get a bit more technical, your phone supports the following Wi-Fi modes: 802.11b, g, n, ac.

USB cables

To load music, pictures, videos, documents or other files from your computer, connect your phone to your computer with a USB cable. To change the type of USB connection (if necessary), swipe the status bar down and tap USB.



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Tip: make sure you connect the phone to a high power USB port. Typically, these are located directly on your computer.

Note: the first time you use a USB connection, your computer may indicate that drivers are being installed. Follow any prompts you see to complete the installation. This may take a few minutes.

- For Microsoft® Windows®: on your computer, choose Start, then select Windows Explorer from your list of programs. In Windows Explorer, your phone will appear as a connected drive (mass storage device) where you can drag and drop files, or it will appear as an MTP or PTP device that lets you use Windows Media Player to transfer files. For more instructions or driver files, visit www.motorola.com/support.
- For Apple™ Macintosh™: use Android File Transfer. available at www.android.com/filetransfer.

Share your data connection

Your computer can access the Internet through your phone's mobile network — you just need a USB cable.

Tip: to share a Wi-Fi connection, see "Wi-Fi hotspot".

- 1 Connect your phone to your computer using a USB cable. **Note:** if your computer is running something older than Microsoft® Windows® 7 or Apple™ Macintosh™ OSX, it might require special configuration.
- 2 On your phone, tap Apps (:::) > a Settings, then make sure the Wi-Fi switch is set to off

3 In Settings, tap More > Tethering & mobile hotspot, then select **USB tethering** to start the connection.

To stop the connection, deselect **USB tethering**, then disconnect your phone from your computer.

Data usage

You can track the amount of data your phone uploads and downloads

Find it: Apps (:::) > Settings > Data usage

Your phone shows a data usage graph. Below the graph. apps appear in order of highest to lowest data usage. Apps that use a lot of data might also use a lot of battery power.

Aeroplane mode

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Some apps transfer data in the background when you're not viewing them — to stop an app from doing this, tap it and then tick Restrict app background data.

To turn off background data use for all apps, just tap Menu § > Restrict background data.

Note: usage information is provided to help you manage your phone. This may not match the amounts charged by your service provider, as they're not measured in the same way.

To choose which SIM card is used for data services tap Apps (:::) > the Settings > SIM cards > Mobile data and select a network.

NFC.

Near Field Communication technology lets you instantly share an item on your phone (such as a web link, contact or a photo) by touching the back of your phone to the back of another NFC-enabled device

Find it: Apps (:::) > Settings > More > NFC

Share with Android Beam™

Use Android Beam to share content on your phone with another NFC-enabled phone or tablet.

Note: the other device must support NFC, too.

- 1 Open the screen that contains the item you want to share.
- 2 Touch the back of your phone to the back of the other device

When the devices connect, you'll see Touch to beam on your phone.

3 Touch your screen to share the item.

Receive with NFC

Receive web links, e-coupons, brochures, maps and more from an NFC tag. Look for the NFC logo on posters, signs, store displays and other areas. Just touch the back of your phone to the logo to receive its tag information.

Bluetooth & Wi-Fi one-touch setup

Just touch your phone to an NFC-enabled Bluetooth device or Wi-Fi access point to automatically pair or connect with the device.

Mobile payment

You can use any secure payment app to pay for your purchase (where available).

Look for the NFC logo to confirm that you can make a mobile payment. Touch the back of your phone to the payment device to pay for your purchase.

Security

Mobile payments, wireless connections and content sharing all demand security:

- Range: NFC only works over a short range (about
- 4 cm/1.5 inches), so it's unlikely you'll connect by mistake
- if you did, you would still have to accept the connection to send or receive information.

• Encryption: your phone uses the latest security, encryption and authentication features to protect your personal information for mobile payments and content sharing.

Your cloud

One account with access to everything, everywhere phone, tablet, computer.

Sync your Google account

When you log in to the same Google account, all devices can get to all the same apps, contacts, films, books and music from Google Play. Plus you share the same Gmail. Google Calendar[™] and Google Mobile[™]. To add accounts to your phone, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (Settings > Accounts, then tap + Add account > Google.

Phone & tablet

Your Android™ phone and tablet can work together to help you get the most out of both:

- Transfer media and files: copy files to your phone and transfer them to other devices - see "Transfer files"
- Phone hotspot: if you have a Wi-Fi tablet, turn your phone into a Wi-Fi hotspot to let your tablet access the Internet anywhere - see "Wi-Fi hotspot".
- Bluetooth™ accessories: if you have a Bluetooth keyboard or other accessories to use with your tablet, remember you can use them with your phone, too. To connect them, see "Bluetooth wireless"

Memory card

You can choose to use your SD card as portable or internal storage:

- Portable storage: store your pictures, videos, audio and other media files. You can remove the SD card at any time and transfer it to another device.
- Internal storage: in addition to your media files, you can store downloaded apps and games. The SD card acts as an extension of the internal storage of your phone.

After you have inserted an SD card into your phone, you will be prompted to select either portable or internal storage.

To manually set your SD card to internal storage, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iii) > (iv) Settings > Storage & USB, then select your SD card and tap Menu > Settings > Format as internal.

Caution: if your SD card is set to internal storage, it is formatted and encrypted to protect your information. If you want to use it as portable storage, or in another device, you'll need to format it. Before doing so, please remember that formatting erases all the data stored on your SD card.

Tip: use a Class 10 memory card.

Note: your phone supports memory cards up to 2 TB.

Mount or unmount memory card

To mount a memory card, simply put it into your phone (see "Put in the cards & power on").

Caution: do not remove an SD card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

Erase memory card content

To delete all the information (music, photos and files) from your memory card, tap Apps (:::) > is Settings > Storage & USB. Tap the SD card name, then tap Menu > Format.

Virtual Private Networks (VPN)

A VPN lets you access files on a secured network (such as an office network with a firewall). Contact the network administrator to ask for VPN settings and any additional apps or other requirements.

To enter VPN settings, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iv) > More > VPN. Tap + to add a new VPN. Choose the type of VPN and enter settings from the network administrator. The network is stored in the VPN list so you can select it whenever you need to connect.

Mobile network

You should not need to change any network settings. Contact your service provider for help.

To see network settings options, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iiii) > (iv) > More > Mobile networks.

Note: your phone supports most networks. Contact your service provider for help.

Aeroplane mode

Use aeroplane mode to turn off all your wireless connections — useful when flying. Swipe down the status bar with two fingers, then tap Aeroplane mode.

Note: when you select aeroplane mode, all wireless services are disabled. You can then turn Wi-Fi and/or Bluetooth™ power back on if permitted by your airline. Other wireless voice and data services (such as calls and text messages) remain off in aeroplane mode. Emergency calls to your region's emergency number can still be made.



Find it: Apps (:::) > (iii) > (Settings > Security

The easiest way to protect your phone is to use **Screen lock**. You can choose to swipe to unlock (less secure) or enter a pattern, PIN or passcode to unlock your phone.

Screen lock

To keep your phone secure, you can make the touchscreen lock when it goes to sleep.



Find it: Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iv) > Settings > Security > Screen lock, then select the lock type:

- None: turn off the screen lock.
- Swipe: tap (a) and drag up.
- Pattern: draw a pattern to unlock.
- PIN: enter four to sixteen digits to unlock.
- Password: enter four to sixteen letters, digits or symbols to unlock.

Note: you can use your fingerprint to unlock your phone. To set up the fingerprint sensor, tap Apps (:::) > a Settings > Security > Fingerprint.

To change when your touchscreen goes to sleep, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (issplay > Sleep.

Note: you can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see "Emergency calls"). A locked phone still rings, and you do not need to enter a PIN or password to answer a call.

Can't unlock?

Pattern, PIN or password: if you forget your pattern, PIN or password, you can enter your Google account email and password to unlock the phone.

If you don't have a Google account on your phone, contact your service provider to have your device factory reset.

Warning: a factory reset will delete all data on your phone.

Screen pinning

Need to keep an important screen handy, such as a boarding pass or shopping voucher? Pin the screen for easy access.

To set up screen pinning, tap Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iii) > (iii) > (iv) > Security > Screen pinning.

To pin a screen, open the app you want to pin, touch and hold Overview , and scroll up. Tap .

To unpin the screen, touch and hold Back \(\lambda \) and Overview \square at the same time.

SIM card lock

Caution: if you enter an incorrect SIM PIN three times, your phone locks your SIM card and asks for your PIN unlock code. Contact your service provider for your PIN unlock code

You shouldn't need to use this feature, but to set a SIM card. PIN that you must enter when you turn on your phone, tap > Lock SIM card

To set your SIM PIN, enter a 4-digit code. To change your code, choose Change SIM PIN.

Encrypt your phone

Caution: if you forget your encryption code, you cannot recover the data stored on your phone or memory card. Encrypting your files can take an hour or more. Leave your phone plugged in and be careful not to interrupt the process. Encryption protects the accounts, settings, apps and files on your phone, so that people cannot access them if your phone is stolen.

You shouldn't need to use this feature, but to encrypt your phone and require a PIN or password whenever you turn on your phone, tap Apps (:::) > a Settings > Security > Encrypt phone.

Back up & restore

Find it: Apps (:::) > (iii) > (iiii) > Backup & reset > Back up my data, then tap the switch to turn it on

Your Google account data is backed up online. If you reset or replace your phone, just log in to your Google account to restore the contacts, events and other details you synced with the account
