Important - The telephone works in the GSM $900 / 1800 \mathrm{MHz}$. Prior to switching on the phone, a SIM Card must be correctly inserted.

## 1. Introduction

Any corrections or modifications arising from mistakes, inaccuracies, and the phone or software upgrades might be made without prior notifications; such changes, however, will be reflected in the updated versions of the User Manual. 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## 2. Accessories

Use only batteries, chargers, and other accessories recommended by the phone's Manufacturer. Check at your point of sale what accessories are available in your area.

## 3. Safety Precautions

Reading the guidelines below will minimize the risk of misusing the phone.

- USING - The telephone emits electromagnetic field that might negatively interfere with other electronic devices including medical equipment.
- Never use the phone wherever such use is prohibited, in hospitals, airplanes, refueling points or at proximity to flammable materials. Using the phone in such places might expose others to danger.
- Never use the phone without a headset while driving.
- A device and its accessories might contain small parts. Keep the phone and all parts out of reach of children.
- SERVICE - Never repair nor modify the phone on your own; all repairs should be made by authorized service only.
- CLEANING - Never clean the phone with any
chemicals or corrosives.
- TORCH - Never look directly into the beam of light.
- HEARING AID- If you have a hearing aid, the phone volume should be carefully adjusted in line with the hearing aid sensitivity.
- ELECTRONIC MEDICAL EQUIPMENT - Your phone is a radio transmitter, that might interfere with the performance of electronic medical equipment or implants, heart pace makers, insulin pumps, etc. Keeping a distance no shorter than 15 cm between the phone and the implant is recommended. To learn more about it, contact your health care provider or manufacturers of such medical equipment.
- WATERPROOF - The phone is NOT waterproof. Keep it dry at all times.
- DUSTPROOF - The phone is NOT dustproof, never use the phone in the area with increased level of dust. Protect the phone against metal chips, that might cause the device to malfunction.
- DISPLAY SCREEN - Avoid pressing too hard on the 12

LCD display screen and using sharp tools; otherwise the display screen might be damaged.

- Never use any metal objects to press the battery contacts together as doing so might cause an explosion.
- Never expose the phone to either low or high temperature, direct sunlight, and high humidity. Never place the phone next to heating devices such as radiators, heaters, ovens, furnaces, camp fires, barbeque, etc.
- PROTECT YOUR HEARING!


Prolonged exposure to sounds of high volume might damage your hearing. Listen to music at a moderate level, and do not keep the phone too close to an ear, while using a speakerphone. Lower the volume prior to using headphones.

## 5. SIM \& MicroSD Card Installation

The SIM Card slot is located under the battery.
Before installing the card, make sure the phone is
switched off, and it is not connected to an AC adapter or any other accessories.

- Place the phone face down, and slide down the battery cover to remove it.

- Carefully insert the SIM Card into the slot, and close the slot with the metal contacts facing downwards. Make sure the notch on the Card is located on the right down corner.

- There is a MicroSD memory card next to the SIM Card slot. Move the pin towards OPEN (to the side closer to the edge), and then lift it up. Insert the microSD Card so that the microSD Card contacts will touch the phone contacts, close the pin towards LOCK.

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Be careful while using memory cards especially while inserting and removing the card. Some memory cards must be formatted on a computer before the first use. Regularly make backup copies of data stored on cards used in other devices, if you use SD Cards! Misuse or
other factors might damage the card or make the card lose its content.

- Insert the battery so that the contacts +/- will go to the front of the phone.



## 6. SIM Card Precautions

- Switch off the phone and wait several seconds prior to inserting or removing the SIM Card.
- Be careful while handling the SIM Card, do not bend it or scratch it.
- If the SIM Card is not properly installed or damaged, a message „Insert SIM Card" will appear on the screen after switching on the phone. Make sure the Card is properly inserted and it is not damaged, and then switch on the phone again. If the message „Insert SIM Card" is still there, take the SIM Card back to your GSM network service provider to have it replaced.


## 7. Battery \& Back Cover Installation

- Gently insert the battery; make sure to properly position its metal contacts.
- To install the back cover, slide it upwards, until it clicks.



### 7.1 Charging

Never use a charger or battery that is damaged or not
manufactured by the Manufacturer. Accessories of different type or modifications might damage the phone and might give basis for violation of regulations pertaining to radio devices, and might void the warranty.

When the battery is discharged, there will be an icon of the empty battery displayed on the screen, and you will hear a sound alert (if warning alerts are enabled). To charge the battery, plug the charger to the power outlet and to the phone.
The battery icon will keep blinking as long as the battery is being charged. The blinking will stop as soon as the phone is fully charged, or the phone is disconnected from the charger.

## Important!

While charging, the air temperature must be between $0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$.

After certain time, batteries wear out; therefore, their performance time will get shorter and shorter over time.

### 7.1.1 Desktop Charger (Option)

If you use a desktop charger, first you need to plug the small plug into the desktop charger slot, and then plug the other end of the charger into the power outlet. To charge the battery, the only thing you need to do is to place the phone onto the charger with its metal contacts going downwards.

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### 7.2 External Display 1,44"

There is a display screen on the external side of the flip cover, displaying the most important information. To backlight the display screen for a moment and to see time, date, and the day of the week press the keys „+" or „-". If there is any missed phone call or an unread text message, you will see a corresponding icon under the clock.

While having an incoming phone call, the Caller's phone number (or name, if available) will be displayed.

## 8. Entering Text

You can enter any words, numbers, symbols, and punctuation marks.
To select the size of letters to be entered and to enter
digits, while creating a text message, press " $\#$ ", press keys Up/Down to select the method you need and press the Left Function Key to confirm. The selected text input method will be visible in the right top corner of the display screen.

To enter symbols:
Press"*" to access the symbol chart. To navigate within the chart, press keys Up/Down. To enter a selected symbol, press OK.

## 9. Using the Phone

### 9.1 Switching on the Phone

Press and hold the key $\widetilde{(1)}$ on the keypad to switch on/off the phone.
If the SIM Card is protected by the PIN Code, enter

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the code, and press the LFK to confirm. Use the right key to delete digits if you have entered any digits by mistake.

## Important!

If PIN \& PUK codes were not provided along with the SIM Card, contact your service provider.
If the PIN has been inserted incorrectly 3 times, the SIM will be locked, and entering the PUK will be required.

- Enter PUK and press "OK" to confirm.
- Enter a new PIN Code and press "OK" to confirm.


### 9.2 Update Time \&Date

The phone has a feature of updating the time and date automatically, while switching on the phone, the time
and date will be automatically downloaded from the GSM network. If, for whatever reason, the date and time are not automatically updated, such information might be manually entered. In menu select Settings>Phone Settings>Time \& Date. Use the numeric keys to enter the correct time. If you make a mistake, press keys M1 and M2 to navigate right/left between characters. Press the key Down, enter the correct date. Press the RFK to confirm.

Language should be automatically set. If you want to change a language, go to Błąd! Nie można odnaleźć źródła odwołania.

### 9.3 Making Phone Calls

Enter the phone number. Press "Delete" to delete a digit entered by mistake.

Press to select a number you wish to call. Press „End Call" to quit.
Press $\sqrt{(1)}$ to end a phone call.

## Important!

While making an international phone call, press "*" twice in order to get an international prefix " + " before the country code (instead of 00).

### 9.3.1 Dialing Number from Phone Book

In Idle mode, press the LFK Menu, to enter the main Menu.

Use keys Up/Down, to go to the Phonebook and press the LFK to select.
If you look for a certain number, enter the first letter of the name and select the Contact you are looking
for.
Press $\sim$ to make a phone call.
Speed Dial : in Idle Mode press the RFK Phonebook to enter the Phonebook.

### 9.4 Answering Phone Calls

Open a flip to answer a phone call (if such an option is enabled). With the flip open, or when answering phone by opening a flip cover is disabled, press to answer a phone call. You can also reject a phone call by pressing the red receiver (1).
Press (1) to end a phone call, or close the flip (if such an option is enabled).

### 9.5 Adjusting Volume

While talking, use the side key $+/$ - to adjust the
conversation volume. Volume level indicator is visible on the display screen.

## Important!

Using a headset at high volume might damage your hearing.

Carefully adjust volume while using the phone.

While having a phone conversation, press the Left Function Key to enter phone call options -in Options, you can select the following:

### 9.7.1 Speakerphone Mode

While having a phone conversation, press the RFK to enable the speakerphone mode. The speakerphone mode allows you to have a phone conversation without holding a phone next to your ear. You can
talk to the mike from a distance of about $0,5 \mathrm{~m}$ for your voice to be understandable. Use side keys +/- to adjust volume.

Press this key again to return to the normal mode.

### 9.7.2 Call Waiting

It is a feature provided by your service provider. If, while having a phone conversation, somebody tries to call you, you will be notified about it by a special beep. In such a case, you can suspend the current phone call in Options. To enable such service, go to Settings > Call Settings > Call Waiting.

While having a conversation, there is the Caller's number and phone call duration displayed on the display screen.

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If the Caller ID option is disabled, a message „Unavailable" or "Unknown" or "Private" will appear on the screen.

## 10. Phonebook

You can store up to 300 Contacts in the Phonebook.

### 10.1 Entering a New Contact

- Press Menu, there is the Phonebook at the top
of the list. Press OK.
- Select Options>New
- Select the location to save the new Contact, either on the SIM Card or the phone memory.
- Enter the Contact's name and phone number.
- If you save the Contact in the phone memory, you can additionally enter his/her home phone
number, a special ringtone, or add him/her to the group.

Use Up/Down to move on, and select Edit.

- To save a Contact, select Save.
- Press ${ }^{(1)}$, to see a home screen, Delete, to delete a letter/digit, Return to return to the previous Menu.


## Important!

While entering foreign numbers, always enter " + "
(instead of " 00 ") prior to entering the actual number.

### 10.2 Speed Dial

There are 8 numeric keys (2-9) available for speed dialing.

Key 1 is for voicemail.

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### 10.2.1 Assigning Phone Number to Keys 2-9

To assign phone numbers to keys 2-9 to be dialed in speed dialing, follow the steps below:

- Press Menu> Phonebook. Press OK.
- Select Options>Other> Speed Dial. Press OK.
- Use keys Up/Down to select the key you wish
to assign a phone number to, press Options>Edit
- Enter the number or press Phonebook and find the Contact you need using the keypad, keys up/down, and press OK to confirm.
Follow the same procedure to assign the other keys.


### 10.2.2 Programming M1 \& M2 Keys

To quick program the key M 1 or M 2 , press and hold it.
Next, enter the name, use the key down to go to the
box Number, and enter the phone number. Press Save (Left Function Key).

You can also program M1 and M2 keys in menu: SOS>Family/Friend Phone Number M1/M2. Select the key you wish to program, press Options, and select if you want to add the Contacts from the Phonebook or manually. Select the Contact or enter the number and press the LFK to confirm.

### 10.3 Managing Entries in the Phonebook

- Press Menu, there is the Phonebook on the top of the list. Press OK.
- Select any Contact and press Options.

## 11. Text Messages

### 11.1 Creating and Sending Text Messages

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Create Message, and then New Text Message.
- To create a multimedia message, select Create

Message >New MMS

- Enter the text, and then click Options
- Select Send To to enter the Recipient's phone
number. Or you can get it from the Phonebook. You can select multiple recipients for this message. If you want to select the Recipient from the Phonebook, use keys Up/Down to select the Contact, press the Camera button to mark/unmark the Contact. As soon as you mark all Contacts, press Options>Done.

While entering the message, press Options and select:

- Send to, allows you to send a message to recipients,
- Use template, to enter ready-to-go text message
- Enter Contact, to enter the Contact's name and phone number
- Save in Drafts, to save a message draft
- Quit, leaves the text input mode.

While creating a multimedia message, you can add:

- Recipients
- Message subject
- Message content
- Photos
- Audio file
- Other attachments: Text, Slide, Previous Slide, Photo, Audio, Video


## Important:

Polish diacritics (ą,ć,ę,ł,ń,ó,s,s,ź,ż) take up more memory, and therefore using them limits the number of total characters you can send in a single text

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message.
A text message might be sent even if it is longer than the allowed number of characters for a single message. Longer message are sent in two or more messages. A charge for each message might apply as per your service provider's price list.

### 11.2 Inbox

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Inbox.
- Select a message from the list by clicking Options and then Open.
- Use the key Up/Down to scroll down the message and read it in full.
- Press Options > Reply>Text or Reply>MMS to send a message to the Sender.
- Press Options > Connect to dial the Sender's
number.
- Press Options > Forward to forward the message.
- Press Options> Delete to delete the message
- Press Options> Transfer to transfer the message to SIM Card or the phone
- Press Options> Copy to copy the message to

SIM or phone

- Press Options > Add Sender To to add the message Sender to the Phonebook
- Press Options > Details to see the message details.

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### 11.3 Sentbox

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Sent.
- Select Options>Open to see the entire message.
- In Options you can forward, delete, transfer the message, call the Sender and get details displayed.


### 11.4 Drafts

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Drafts
- Select the message from the list by clicking

Options and then Open

- In Options you can send a message, insert a template, insert the Contact or save a message.


### 11.5 Outbox

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Outbox
- Select the message from the list by clicking

Options and then Open

- In Options you can send a message again, insert a template, insert the Contact or save a message.


### 11.6 Text \& Multimedia Message Settings

- Select Menu and go to Messages
- Select Message Settings.
- Select SMS Settings to update Settings of text messages. You can choose one of the following options:

- Select MMS Settings to update settings of multimedia messages. You can choose one of the
following options:

| Options | Set priority time, delivery report, <br> receive confirmation request, send <br> anonymously |

If there are any problems with sending multimedia messages, please contact your service provider to enter the required settings.

### 11.7 Message Memory Status

Select Menu>Messages>Memory Status, to see how much of the phone memory has been taken up by text and multimedia messages.

### 11.8 Multimedia Messages MMS

To create a multimedia message:

- Select MENU, next Messages > Create

Message >New MMS

- Multimedia message might include photos, videos, and audio files. To add a selected file, use keys Up/Down to select the symbol of a photo/music note/plus, click Options>Edit and select an item.


## 12. Emergency Phone Call

When the phone is switched on, you can always manually dial 112 and confirm by pressing the green receiver

Most networks- but not all - accept emergency numbers (112, 999 etc.) even if the SIM Card is not
active or there is no SIM Card at all. To learn more, contact your service provider.

If the phone is switched off, switch it back on. If you don't know the phone code or PIN Code, in the code input box enter the number 112, and press the LFK.

### 12.1 Emergency Button

To make an emergency phone call, press and hold the emergency key SOS on the back of the phone for 3 seconds. The phone will automatically dial previously assigned numbers. If the phone call is not answered within 25 seconds, the phone will dial the next number. Calling is repeated three times until the phone call is answered. If nobody picks up the phone, the phone will send an emergency text message (if such an option is enabled) to numbers listed as

Emergency Contacts and it will remain in the emergency mode for an hour to automatically answer the first incoming phone call. In emergency mode, to call the next person listed as an Emergency Contact, press the RFK. To finish the emergency procedure, press and hold the emergency button again.

Automatic calls to 112 are not allowed. Do not list this number as your Emergency Contact. Remember, for this feature to work, first you must enable it in MENU.

### 12.1.1 Emergency [SOS] Settings

To enter Emergency Settings go to MENU>SOS.

- Select User Info to enter important information about the User such as his/her diseases,
- Select Emergency Contacts, to enter phone numbers (Contacts) for the phone to dial in case of emergency procedure. You can list up to 5 numbers. Select the entry number from the list, press Options>From Phonebook to select a number from the Phonebook, or Options>Enter to manually enter the number using the keypad. After entering, press Save.
- Select Family/Friend No M1/M2 to assign phone numbers to keys M1 \& M2. Select the key to assign a phone number to, whether you want to get this number from the Phonebook or enter it manually. After entering, press Save.
- To enable this feature, select the SOS Button and press the option Enable.
- Select the Emergency SMS for the phone not only to dial the listed phone numbers, but also to text Emergency Contacts.
Click Edit Message to update the message content.
- Select Alarm SOS, to enable/disable sound signal.


### 12.2 Call Log

All received, missed, and dialed phone numbers are recorded in the Call Log. The Call Log lists no more than 50 most recent phone calls.

## Dialing most recent phone calls

If you press the green receiver $\sim$, all most recent phone calls will be displayed.

If you go to the main Menu and you use the arrows to find Call Log and you press OK, you will 54
view phone calls grouped into:

1. Missed phone calls
2. Dialed phone calls
3. Received phone calls
4. Restricted phone calls (attempted phone calls from blacklisted phone numbers).
You can also clear Call Log and check duration of phone calls.

- Press $\quad$ to select the number or select

Options to view the following:

| Details | Displays the phone call details |

## 13. Radio FM

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The telephone can receive radio waves at frequencies of 87.5 up to 108.0 MHz .

Important: If the reception is low, connect the headset to the phone. The headset wire doubles as an antenna.

- In Idle mode, press Menu, use keys Up/Down to find Radio FM.
- Use the side keys +/- to adjust volume, keys

M1/M2 to go to the previous/next saved radio station,

- Press the key to pause playing the radio,
- Press the LFK to select the following options:
- Search automatically and save
- Channel List
- Save
- Manual Search
- Use Speakers
- Play in Background
- Recording
- Playlist
- Memory
- You can save selected radio stations under numbers 1-40 and use keys $\mathrm{M} 1 / \mathrm{M} 2$ to scroll up and down, or enter the number and wait a moment to choose.


## - To return to the main Menu press the red receiver (1).

## 14. Multimedia

### 14.1 Photo \& Video Camera

The phone can take photos and record videos. To enable the camera, in Idle mode press the key
(O) or select Menu>Multimedia>Camera. To take a photo, press the key . If the feature Autosave is not enabled, after taking a photo press the LFK (save) to save the image.
To record a video, in Options select the option Video
Camera, or in Idle mode select
Menu>Multimedia>Camera.
To select the option Photos or Recording, press the
LFK. Recording starts as soon as you press the key
〇. Press again to pause. Press the RFK to stop.

To use this feature, installing MicroSD Card (not included in the set) and selecting saving on the memory card are required.

Options>Memory>select the option Memory Card.

### 14.2 Audio Player

Play audio files saved on the phone or in the phone memory. The phone supports AAC, WAV, AMR files.

Some audio files can't be played on the phone as the phone "does not see" them. To open audio files from the memory card, they must be saved in the Audio folder.
While playing, press the dedicated keys - play/ pause; M1 - previous track; M2 - next track. To adjust volume of the player, press the side key +/-.

Press the LFK [Options], to enter the player menu. If the playlist is not empty, you can do the following:

- Set a playlist
- Set a track as a ringtone
- Set replay, random play, and playing in the background.


### 14.3 Video Player

This menu allows you to play video files saved either on the memory card or in the phone. The phone supports 3GP, FLV and AVI files. Some formats can't be played on the phone. The phone has its limitations if it comes to the size and length of video files.

To be able to view the video files from the memory card, they must be saved in the folder Videos. To
start/pause playing a video file, press the camera key. Enter the video file player, press the key Options to do the following: Open, Full Screen, Brightness
Adjustment, Details, Settings Reset.

### 14.4 Voice Recorder

You can record phone conversations, music, and other sounds.

- Select Menu >Multimedia > Voice Recorder (or, while talking, select Menu>Start Recording)
- To start/pause recording, press the key . To stop recording, press the key M2.

If no other destination has been selected, the recorded files are saved in the folder File Manager >Telephone>Audio.

- You can change the location to save files to the memory card; quality of recording might be also changed. To do so, select Options>Memory or


## Options>File Format.

## 15. Tools

### 15.1 My Files

To view files saved in the phone and on the memory card, select: MENU > Tools > My files. After selecting the file you wish, press Options to

- Open the file
- Delete the file
- Details- the file details
- Edit-rename or copy the file
- Mark - mark mulitple files
- Memory Status - see how much memory you have left on the memory card and in the
phone; format a selected memory.


### 15.2 Calendar

The phone has a calendar available at MENU >
Tools > Calendar. Not only can you view the calendar, but also you can add your own entries, set an exact time, date, repeat, and sound alert. To plan a task/event, use keys to go to the date you need, and press the LFK to get the following options:

- New Task
- Show Tasks
- All Tasks
- Clear Today Task
- Clear All
- Go to Date

To navigate between months, use keys * and \#.
Entering a news task, you can set its type:
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- Single - one time reminder about the task at selected time and date,
- Every day - every day reminder about the task at selected time and date
- Every week - every week reminder
- Every month - every month reminder
- Every year - every year reminder


### 15.3 Calculator

## - Press Menu>Tools>Calculator,

- To enter digits, use the keypad,
- Use the key,, ${ }^{* \prime \prime}$, to enter a comma, and arrows

Up/Down to select an operation ( $+,-, x, \div$ ),

- Enter the second number,
- To get a result, use arrows Up/Down to select the equal sign and press OK.


### 15.4 Alarm Clock

It is possible to set 3 independent alarm clocks. They might be either one time or repeated on selected days. When the alarm clock goes off, press Dismiss to stop it or Snooze to put it off in time.

### 16.5 Security

### 16.7.5 Network Selection

Select Menu > Settings >Connections>Network
Selection to Select Network and set Selecting Mode between Manual and Automatic.

## 17. Internet

The Internet browser on the phone allows you to use variety of WAP service.
The phone has preinstalled settings of certain service providers. To activate, select:

Menu > Internet >Settings>Account and select the service provider.

Due to the phone display screen size, websites viewed on the phone might look different than originals. Some details might be invisible.

To learn more about such service availability, pricelist or manuals, contact your service provider. Configuration settings necessary to browse the Internet might be obtained from the Service Provider. Some service providers allow a remote telephone configuration.

## 18. Safe Use

Please read the following rules. Noncompliance with such regulations might be dangerous or illegal. Read the entire User Manual to get more information.

Switch off the phone in proximity to chemical plants, refueling points, and other places that might store explosives.

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## 22. Battery Information

There is a battery in the phone. The battery can be recharged using a charger that is included in the set.

The battery life depends on conditions in which the phone is used. Your distance from a relay transmitter, number and the length of phone calls significantly reduce the battery life. While on the go, the phone switches between relay transmitters and such switching also significantly affects the battery life. After multiple charges and discharges, it is natural for the battery to eventually lose its ability to hold charge. Get a new battery if you notice a significant drop in the battery performance.

Use only batteries recommended by the Manufacturer.

Never leave the charger connected longer than 2-3 days.

Never keep the phone in excessively hot places. High temperatures might negatively impact both the battery and the phone.

Never use a battery that is clearly damaged. Doing so might cause a short circuit, and might damage the phone. Check battery installation for proper polarization.

Leaving the battery in excessively hot or cold places will reduce the battery life. The recommended storage temperature range is between $15^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $25^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$. Installing a cold battery into the phone might cause the phone to malfunction and might damage the phone.

## 23. SAR Information

Information about the impact of radio waves and Specific Absorption Rate [SAR]. This phone model has been designed to meet all international standards pertaining to the impact of radio waves as recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the International Commission on Non-lonizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), an independent scientific organization with a safety margin to protect all people regardless their age and health condition. Such guidelines use a unit of measurement called Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) actual absorption.
As recommended by ICNIRP, the border value of SAR for portable equipment is 2,0 watts per kilogram ( $\mathrm{W} / \mathrm{kg}$ ), and it is an average value per 10 g of tissue.
